In addition, we have witnessed the vicious murders of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, and Ahmaud Arbery, to name a few. Masses of people have not had food. Even now, as I pen this report, gas prices are somewhere in the neighborhood of \$5.00 per gallon. We have also witnessed the tragic murders in Buffalo, New York, where ten people were killed in a grocery store. In Uvalde, Texas, nineteen children and two adults were murdered at Robb Elementary School. To say these are perilous times is an understatement. Yet, the Bible says, *"Nevertheless, God's solid foundation stands firm..."* (2 Timothy 2:19 NIV). In the midst of it all, the Church has sought to be a catalyst for healing, courage, and faith in the face of fear.

Being mindful that our buildings were closed for many months due to COVID, the following pages provide brief reports and pictures of our journey since the last Annual Report. Although it is being issued later in the year than usual; it was still important to me to provide accountability and a record of God's amazing love and provision! By God's grace and your faithful and consistent prayerful support, we have been able to keep our doors open and maintain a relevant ministry—the amazing Cathedral International! Thank you for standing with me over the last three years.

We are grateful for each property; The Cathedral, Family Life Enrichment Center, Technology Center, Cathedral Cafe/Perth Amboy Police Sub-Station, Mattian's Garden, The Mercy House, Donald Hilliard, Jr. Community Affairs Complex, Cathedral International Asbury Park, Cathedral Cornerstone Complex Asbury Park, and our Cranbury Property. By the grace of God, we have been able to upgrade our media technology. I was able to teach virtually and go live on social media every week, and the saints continue to persevere. People continue to accept Jesus as Savior and Lord and unite with His Church. To God be the glory! In spite of it all, we are still here! Did you read what I just said? In spite of it all, we are still here!



- Began teaching Bible Study to our Seniors Ministry every Thursday morning

The COVID-19 pandemic proved to be a challenge during the last two years, but the Spanish Church has remained strong in its membership and fellowship thanks to its leadership and volunteer workers.

These worship services took place first at the FLEC and then at Heritage Hall. I want to thank Deacon Andrew Largie for his assistance in ensuring that Esteban IV and Amy had the proper Ethernet and or WIFI connections to transmit the live worship services. Sis Lauren Hernandez for her assistance in providing an alternative place of worship while the heating system at the FLEC was being repaired. I also want to thank brother Rob and Brother Ed, from Security, for their kind and careful attention to the Spanish Church members and for disinfecting the space before and after our activities. I also want to thank the Spanish Church worship team and musicians of Esteban “Coco” Santana, Minister, Ivette Garcia Santana, Elizabeth Betances, Eliezer Santiago, Jr., and Marisol Santana for their flexibility in working together to make the You Tube live worship experience more authentic.

Also, through the dedication and commitment of Spanish Church leaders like my wife, Marisol Santana, Deacon Miriam Velazques and Dominick Santana (Usher) along with me, were able to stay in touch with all of the membership, ensuring that any and all needs were taken care of. Each member received a call from a Spanish Church leader at least every two weeks.

During the pandemic in 2020 and 2021, the Spanish Church made the following adjustments and or maintained the following ministry programs:

- Leadership Development meeting every first Friday of the month.

We created a nice pamphlet that accompanied the dinner with a Christian message and an invite to our Spanish services. It was well received.

Marisol wrote three different skits under the title: “Come, Let Us Worship.” The program was set up with different Christmas worship songs sung by different members of the Worship Team in between scenes of each skit. The program closed out with a reflection by Pastor Santana.



The broad range of responsibilities in this role allows me the opportunity to serve the people of God and support the Senior Pastor, Bishop Hilliard in the accomplishment of the Church's mission. I also serve in tandem with our dedicated and phenomenal Board of Elders in developing and maintaining a ministry infrastructure that will support the spiritual health and long-term growth of the Church.

Our amazing Pastoral and Leadership Teams, Cathedral Staff and Ministry Volunteers are among some of the hardest working, dedicated, sacrificing, resourceful, loving, and creative, God-fearing people known. For all that you do behind the scenes to serve, care for, and give hope and encouragement; we thank you and give God praise for you. You are extraordinary gifts from God!



When I consider 2021, all I can say is THANK YOU JESUS! I am beyond grateful and celebrate all that God has done and continues to do in, through, and amongst God's people. Although our buildings were closed for the majority of 2021 due to the pandemic, the ministry of Cathedral International remained strong.

The Gospel: Through our streaming platforms, the Message of the Gospel was taught every Sunday and was made available locally, nationally, and to the world! Our Weekly Bible Study, and Adult Sunday School Classes continued online.

Prayer: Early Morning Prayer Calls were held each weekday. And, the Bishop's prayer line remained available to all.

Serving You: Although we had to modify for safety: Baby Dedications, Ocean and Indoor Baptism, Weddings, and Funeral Services were held. Great efforts were made to try to stay in touch with our Cathedral family and friends through phone calls from our Bishop and First Lady, Leadership, and our Staff. Even while working remotely, we sent emails, text messages, and various mailers (letters, postcards, and gifts were even made available to encourage the family).

Understanding that flexibility is extremely important during these unpredictable times - when we could not gather indoors, we shifted to Outdoor Worship Experiences and Drive-Through opportunities. Efforts included Drive-Throughs to distribute ashes for Ash Wednesday, palms for Palm Sunday, and fellowship for Easter 2021. Our outdoor experiences at the beautiful Perth Amboy Waterfront, included a celebration for Bishop Hilliard's birthday, a Back to School Giveaway, and a Bike Blessing. We also sponsored a Thanksgiving Giveaway.

Chief Operating Officer

The pandemic did not deter us from investing in bright minds and dreams. We were able to issue our Cathedral Educare Scholarships as we have done for many years. Our College Care Team was established. Care packages, notes, phone calls, and text messages were sent with love and prayers to encourage our College Students during final exams.

Serving Beyond Our Walls: Understanding the importance of community engagement, we endeavor to cultivate relationships and create partnerships. For our Christmas and Community Outreach, we hosted a Petting Zoo, provided free refreshments, and Toy Give-A-Ways for our children and those in the community. In Perth Amboy, we sent mailers, made personal deliveries, and partnered with the Mayor's office and other community service partners to use their platforms to share some of the ways that Cathedral International was available to support the community.

In the Fight Against COVID-19: In partnership with the state of NJ and Monmouth County, we hosted a Community Pop-up Vaccination Site at Cathedral International Asbury Park. Free transportation to our campus was provided and many were vaccinated. Free food, backpacks, school supplies and other free giveaways were also shared with the community. Cathedral also provided hot meals and support to First Responders working in nursing homes and as Emergency Medical Technicians, Police Officers, Fire Fighters and 911 Dispatch teams.

As our Sanctuaries opened back up in mid-September, our facilities had been sanitized and prepared. And, a few upgrades were made. Our Re-Entry Team ensured that safety protocols were in place to welcome our members and friends back into safe, clean, and beautiful spaces in all locations.

Stewardship: Committed to Missions and Outreach, we provided support for individuals, families, community service partners, American Baptist Churches Missions, Lott Carey Foreign Missions; American Red Cross; Our Local First Responders, Various Disaster Relief Efforts, the NAACP, National Action Network, YMCA, St. Jude's Children's Hospital - just to name a few.

The exterior façade repairs were completed and major roofing and drain replacement progressed on The Cathedral. General ongoing maintenance for Cathedral properties and grounds continues. We forged forward with our Sanctuary Technology Upgrade project for presenting the Gospel in excellence, locally and throughout the world. Praise the Lord!

Our ability to share the Gospel and meet the needs of God's people is made possible by the grace of God, through prayer, and your consistent and generous giving. We are so appreciative of your partnership. THANK YOU for your contributions to this great ministry and to Kingdom work. For all of this, God deserves all the glory!



Treasurer

The year 2021 was full of the Lord's faithfulness and miraculous provision that sustained us. Your consistent giving of Tithes and Offerings have allowed us to operate the ministry through many challenging days. We continued to maintain three locations, host worship services, provide benevolent and mission assistance, maintain several properties, and various ministry related activities. We are committed to being good stewards of the funds received by managing effectively and efficiently.

Our total revenue for 2021 was \$4 million, of which 84% was Tithes and Offerings. In addition to maintaining operations, we were able to do major repairs to several buildings and improve our audio and visual equipment. We look to increase the quality of broadcasting worship services virtually and at our various locations throughout the state of New Jersey.



Total expenses for 2021 were \$3.8 million. Approximately, 74% of our contributions/revenue was used for ministry related work to sustain and advance the Kingdom of God.

Our accounting department was hard at work adjusting to the additional on-line giving platforms and changes to operating procedures to accommodate our virtual operations. Using current technology to process income and disbursements will continue to be a high priority to reduce costs and increase operating efficiency.


The Year 2022:

Some Highlights

- Our incredible Production Team and Music ministry provided weekly support for virtual Bible Study and Sunday Service recordings
- The Cathedral Staff organized and executed Outdoor Worship services on 7/4 (Perth Amboy Waterfront), 7/25 (Ocean Baptism – Asbury Park), and 9/5 (Perth Amboy Waterfront)

- As special events were planned and seasons changed, the staff decorated and beautified our sanctuaries
- When COVID-19 cases rose and we found it necessary to shut down our facilities for a second time, our staff quickly pivoted to provide high quality and spirit-filled virtual services to edify our people, keep our membership engaged, and glorify God

2021 was a challenging year for the Cathedral International Staff, but by the direction given by the Holy Ghost, the protection provided by the Blood of Jesus, and power of God the Father, we were able to persevere through every obstacle. Facilities Department



The Facilities Department is committed to providing a clean, healthy, and safe environment for all eight of our properties, for all who visit our campuses, enter our buildings and for the

communities in which we serve. Our Team supports every service, ministry event and activity held on and off campus. We were faced with another challenging year. The doors of the Church were temporarily closed, however, the day to day business and ministry of Cathedral International remained opened. The Facilities Team was key to keeping the buildings open, grounds maintained, facility equipment running, routine inspections and other city mandates complied and up to date, tenants pleased, transportation fleet operable, seasonal decorations and liturgical paraments and accessories, new safety and security measures implemented and our hearts, minds and souls lifted. The Facilities Department orders and distributes all facilities supplies including Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). A disinfecting – fogging regimen was put in place all buildings, as well as, non-touch infrared thermometers, automatic hand sanitizing units and health protocol signage throughout the buildings.

We value our relationships with our cleaning, plumbing, electric, flooring, painting, general contracting, security and fire systems, heating, ventilation, and air conditioning vendors remained in place and were thoroughly utilized for new installations, maintenance and repairs in 2021. Our Perth Amboy Church building was heavily impacted by hurricanes Henri and Ida. Renovation work began in the sanctuary, two hallways and roof of the Cathedral. We were blessed to remain open during renovations and we look forward to the completion of all work by the end of the third quarter 2022. Other exciting renovations for 2022 include new windows and new landscaping for both the Church and Complex in Asbury Park, and a new roof, gutters and doors for the Complex. The remaining preparation projects for re-opening of the Cathedral Counseling Center should be completed before June of this year. Throughout 2021, the Children's and Teens Sunday School Ministry provided weekly instruction on lessons about Who Jesus Is, How Jesus Loves Us, the Fruits of the Spirit, Putting Jesus First, Hearing God's Voice and how we Belong to God to name a few topics. 
The Mercy house remained open on a weekly basis during the COVID-19 Crisis thanks to a \$25,000.00 New Jersey Pandemic Relief Fund Grant.

We were the only pantry in Perth Amboy open Monday thru Friday.

This grant we received from the Community food bank of New Jersey, enabled us to upgrade our computers for the Mercy House.

We partnered with two organizations who provided volunteers who helped on a daily basis to service the community.

- The Mercy House served 2,400 families with food packages
 - 7560 boxes of fruits and vegetables were given out
- We have two volunteers who delivered to local residents 4800 food packages
- Our very own Brother Jerome Addison delivered to our Cathedral Seniors over 960 food packages



Thanks to the generosity of our Bishop Donald Hilliard the Mercy House received the renovation of our front porch and steps.

The Cathedral Men's Ministry under the leadership of Brother Rob Williams donated toys to our Christmas giveaway where over 100 children received toys.

We hosted a breakfast with Santa event where my family volunteered to cook and serve breakfast to the children and parents present.

Deacon Chris Nicholas volunteered with various men from Cathedral to help unload our truck deliveries every 3rd Saturday of the month.

Deacon Chris Nicholas also gifted the Mercy House with a new freezer.

Thanks to various benefactors we were able to purchase four new freezers, and the renovation of the lower level of the Mercy house to provide more storage space.

We are currently working on renovating the 1st floor.




